

Back by Popular Demand— Low Bono

We often encounter customers who need help with family law legal matters but many are unable to afford a family law attorney to represent them or to even help with paperwork. Clerk Green is pleased to announce the return this summer of our helpful Low Bono Program. Low Bono allows citizens with a family law legal matter to schedule an appointment with a local, licensed attorney. The time isn't free but it is very inexpensive. A 30-minute to 60-minute meeting with an attorney is sometimes all that is needed to make sure self-represented litigants have the right forms filled out correctly before filing. This saves everyone (citizens, clerks, judges) a lot of headache. You'll soon be

able to refer citizens to the new Low Bono program through our Civil Department where Supervisor Becky Crews will be happy to answer any questions and connect those in need with attorneys who will meet with them on site here at the courthouse or online. Look for an official release soon. Thank you, Brian, Becky, Amie, Tracie, and Justin for getting this very important service back up and running. (*Low Bono was paused during the pandemic.)
