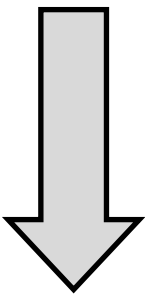
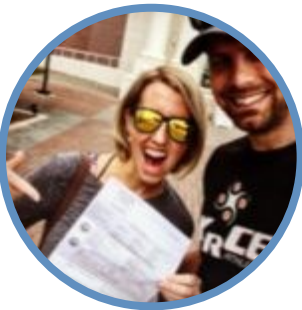
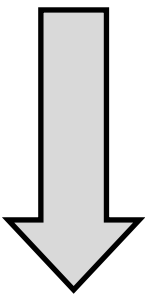



OBTAINING A MARRIAGE LICENSE IN CLAY COUNTY, FLORIDA



- Marriage licenses are issued by the Clay County Clerk of Court and Comptroller, Tara S. Green.
- The Clerk of Court does not conduct marriage ceremonies .
- Marriage licenses issued in Clay County are only valid for marriage ceremonies conducted in the state of Florida.
- An Appointment is required; scan this QR code to schedule or go to the Marriage License page at clayclerk.com:

- Written application required: parties must file a signed affidavit before a clerk who administers an oath (reciting true/correct ages of the parties), unless both parties are over age 18, except as provided Florida Statute 741.0405.
- Application is not complete until both parties appear in person at the Clerk's Office, even if application is done online at clayclerk.com; follow instructions on the website.
- Marriage License Application Fee = \$86 (less if premarital course completed; additional fees may apply)
- Premarital Statement Form is required for all couples and must be signed in front of the Clerk at our office.
- License valid 60 days after issuance; 3-day waiting period required for Florida residents unless premarital class completed and proof of class completion is provided prior to issuance.
- Marriage license must be certified and filed with Clerk's Office where issued within 10 days of the ceremony.
